What do Dental Assistants do?

Dental assistants work with dentists in the delivery of quality oral healthcare and are valuable members of the dental care team. Dental assistants perform many tasks, ranging from patient care and taking x-rays to recordkeeping and scheduling appointments. Their duties are among the most comprehensive and varied in the dental office. Dental assistants work under the supervision of dentists and work closely with dental hygienists in their day-to-day activities. If you have strong communication skills, enjoy working with your hands as well as your mind and want a career with responsibility, dental assisting is for you.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have many opportunities for employment as a dental assistant, but first you will need to earn a certificate or an associate degree. Accredited programs include classroom and laboratory work in which students learn about teeth, gums, jaws and other areas that may require dental work. These programs also include supervised practical experience.

As a Dental Assistant you will:

- Help dentists by handing them instruments during procedures
- Instruct patients in proper dental hygiene
- Prepare the work area for patient treatment by setting out instruments and materials
- Process x-rays and complete lab tasks, under the direction of a dentist
- Schedule patient appointments
- Sterilize dental instruments
- Work with patients to make them comfortable in the dental chair and to prepare them for treatments


