You will have plenty of employment opportunities as a dispatcher and will most likely learn through on the job training, although a certificate or associate degree in business and communications can strengthen your skill set. While working with an experienced dispatcher, new employees monitor calls and learn how to operate a variety of communications equipment, including telephones, radios, and various wireless devices.

As a Dispatcher you will:

- > Confer with customers or supervising personnel to address questions, problems, or requests for service or equipment
- Monitor personnel or equipment locations and coordinate service and schedules
- > Oversee all communications within specifically assigned territories
- > Relay work orders, messages, or information to or from work crews, supervisors, or field
